URGENT APPEAL FOR SISTERS IN ZAMBIA

(This is an abbreviated repeat of an appeal emailed to members in U.S. and Canada some weeks ago.)

Last October, our Readers' Group organized a small pilgrimage of Group members from different parts of the world, to visit Italy to celebrate the 50th anniversary of Maria Valtorta's death. This pilgrimage group included Sister Christine Kabumbu (A Readers' Group member for many years, with whom I stayed during a visit to Zambia a few years ago) together with Sisters Mercy Zimba and Sabina Namfukwe - of the Sisters of the Child Jesus community in Zambia.

A few months ago, a damaging fire occurred in the convent of one of the Zambia Sisters' communities, which has caused financial hardship to the whole community of which Sister Christine is Superior. [See this link; http://www.valtorta.org.au/Video/KabumbuConventFire.wmv]

I have emailed Sister Christine, offering to launch an appeal to our members, for financial help to assist with the community's urgent needs. Here is part of her reply:

Dear David, firstly, we have a problem of transport. We are all relying on one vehicle which we are sharing with sisters from the other community, whose convent was burnt. A second hand car would cost about \$US 6,500.

On 1st April 2012 (Palm Sunday) the entire main block of the convent house got burnt completely with all household goods. The community from there are staying at the Generalate with us which has now become congested.

Before the house was burnt, the purchase of a new house was already on course and we have put the burnt convent rebuilding on hold, to finish purchasing the new house, put it on rent, to contribute to rebuilding of the burnt convent. (We need a lot of help with this rebuilding.)

God bless you, from Sister Christine.

A NEW AND VERY SPECIAL BOOKLET: "THE MANY MEANINGS OF LOVE"

As many of you would know, I've been assembling booklets on different themes from Maria Valtorta's writings for many years. In recent times the idea of a selection of passages on the all-encompassing theme of LOVE has been growing in my mind. MARIA VALTORTA AND LORENZO FERRI

(This is an article by Pietro Ferri, Lorenzo's son, concerns the book "Valtorta and Ferri", available from the Readers' Group. Lorenzo Ferri was an artist and sculptor who worked on drawings under Maria's guidance. The book includes 37 sepia-coloured portraits of Jesus, Mary and others from The Poem, plus over 200 pages with sketches of places, buildings and encounters.

Lorenzo Ferri said that he came to know about Maria Valtorta by means of Father Berti, whom he met during the preparation-display of the project for the Door of St. Peter's Basilica. As they left together, walking towards the Monteverde neighborhood in Rome, he spoke about his research-studies on the Shroud of Turin and about his desire to truly know the Face of Christ.

Father Berti said to him, "There is someone who can describe that same Face, which they see every day." The artist understood he was speaking of visions, and then replied, "Look: in all modesty, I am a scholar; and moreover, I can only accept data which is reliable, data received by experiments. The fresearch on the Shroud is a serious affair, but it would no longer be so if this research-data can include visions and visionaries!" Father Berti answered: "Come to Viareggio; and judge for yourself! Many who have stood before her were astonished!"

Lorenzo Ferri met Maria Valtorta in 1949 at Viareggio where the writer was living, bedridden due to paralysis. She seemed to him to be lucid, practical, insightfully intelligent - the exact opposite of a fanatic! The artist showed her a photograph of his own lifelike reconstruction of the bust of the Shroud - well appreciated by expert Shroud researchers. But from her, it receives a hardly praiseworthy review, because "...it's not like Christ's Face when she

Ferri, overcoming irritation, asks her to describe what she sees; and then he will try to draw it. Thus an adventure begins: the artist, a skeptic who barely manages to restrain impulsivity; and Valtorta, with her authoritative and frank character - they agree to work in a particularly unique manner: sitting with a pad of paper in hand, he gives her his shoulders, so that she can follow the quick sketch and give suggestions. Finally, he fills in the rest, and then submits it for her approval.

The "dictated" illustrations were carried out over of the course of about four years and are not the simple transcription of what Maria Valtorta described. Even if Ferri "entered into the same wavelength" as her, the artist gave life, form, and ambience to the characters' own, unmistakable traits. If one of the drawings might require more time, Lorenzo Ferri completed it at his studio in Rome, in which case her criticism or approval would arrive by mail: "For the Supper, it seems to me that the environment has been Man-God is. I have re-read it for a second time and find it

"Well," concluded Socrates, "if what you want to tell me done well, but what faces!... But why not make the faces as was done, here at my place, in 1950? Moreover, I only halfway like the resurrection of Lazarus - so naked, This is the reason Socrates was considered a great whereas he was covered in bandages. That Face of Jesus is really handsome, gentle, expressive - exactly as I remember Him during the (rare) moments when He was happy, serene, prayerful" (Letter of Maria Valtorta to Lorenzo Ferri, July 21, 1953).

> One day, while entering Valtorta's room, Ferri finds her with an extremely white face. She explains that she saw Jesus – in the courtyard (where she could not go) – and He was showing His approval by nodding in front of Ferri's pastel portraits of the Apostles - having been placed outside in order to make the fixative dry – approving, with the exception of John, drawn with an excessively strong-willed chin. Without hesitation, the artist cut up the paper, and redrew the chin.

> The meeting of Lorenzo Ferri and Maria Valtorta was a relationship between strong personalities that are not easily influenced; personalities that are dialectical; neither one of them lacking reservations; which led, ultimately, to sincere ties of friendship, reinforced by commonly shared religious convictions. In the letter that Valtorta wrote to Ferri on October 23, 1954, there is a reproach for not having become more alive; but Ferri was again absorbed in his studies of the Shroud, about which precisely Maria Valtorta's initial comment - "Professor, study better" [that is, his first work didn't match Christ's real Face sufficiently] had entirely overturned all the knowledge he had acquired [which made him work harder and achieve better results].

> There exists a correspondence between Valtorta's descriptions and Ferri's studies of the Shroud, for which the artist spent years of research on the cloth and three stages of scientific testing for a [lifelike, accurate] plastic reconstruction [or rendition]. One of the sketches he made under the guidance of Valtorta's dictation made him realize that he had, right there under his eyes, a result bearing a complete resemblance to the one that had cost him years of effort and experimentation to make. [That is, after a quickly drawn sketch, during which she dictated which changes to make, he was able to draw the equivalent level of accuracy and detail that he could only achieve after years of Shroud research].

> Ferri saw his encounter with Valtorta as being like the keystone [or cornerstone] of his Shroud research of already twenty years and already too closely bound-up, until that time, to undisputed and universally accepted knowledge. She was a part or member of that host of people -(which the artist called, "perfect opposites") - who, forcing him to focus on a problem, was always bringing him to more and more in-depth, scientific testing. For his part, Ferri was a true witness of Valtorta throughout those years, of which the personal letters and the artistic illustrations are a living reflection.
